As a parent, I want to make life as easy for my three kids as possible. But, I also want them to be prepared for life when they have to make tough decisions or life is not easy.


I don't have the answer to the question, "how convenient is to convenient?" Is convenient good or bad? Is it teaching my children to be impatient?
